Destination Miami

A private research university with more than 17,000 students from around the world, the University of Miami is a vibrant and diverse academic community focused on teaching and learning, the discovery of new knowledge, and service. The University's main campus is home to two colleges and ten schools on a 230-acre tract in suburban Coral Gables. The campus is one of South Florida's prime destinations for a wide variety of cultural offerings and home to the Miami Hurricanes, the celebrated intercollegiate athletics program.

South Florida's subtropical climate and attractions make it a unique place to visit and explore. The Everglades National Park, John Pennekamp Coral Reef State Park in the Florida Keys, Fairchild Tropical Botanic Garden, and historic Miami Beach are just a few examples of fun and exciting places to visit.

Residential Students

Explore college life at the University of Miami. Residential students live on the main campus in one of the University's residential colleges. Students are assigned to same-gender rooms and live in double-occupancy rooms. Rooms include desks, beds, closets, and bureaus. Housing facilities have 24-hour security, air-conditioning, internet access, study lounges, laundry facilities, an ATM, and vending areas. Within a short walk, students can easily access the University's libraries, outstanding sports and recreational facilities, and the Student Activities Center.

Commuter Students

The commuter program is for students who will live with parents or relatives in Miami-Dade or Broward County. As part of the program, commuter students attend classes, eat lunch on campus, enjoy access to the fitness center, and take part in evening and weekend enrichment activities.

Commuter students should plan to spend time on campus in the evening and on weekends to participate in study sessions, campus activities, and weekend excursions. The level of on-campus involvement will shape individual student experiences. Activities outside of the classroom provide commuters with time to bond and build community with a diverse group of students from around the world and form lasting friendships.

**Residential students are not permitted to bring a car to campus, nor travel in the cars of commuter students. Commuter students are responsible for their own transportation to and from campus.

Student Life

Students in our three-week Summer Scholars Program typically attend classes Monday through Friday, from 8:20 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Students in our two-week UM Academies typically attend classes Monday through Friday, from 9:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Classes consist of lectures, tests, quizzes, projects, homework, and a final exam.*

Students use their free time to work on class assignments, study at the library, swim at the campus pool, exercise at the Wellness Center, explore the campus, and join evening and weekend activities. On weekends, students have the opportunity to explore Miami and South Florida by participating in activities organized and chaperoned by program staff. Weekend activities may include: snorkeling in Key Largo, attending a Miami Marlins baseball game, touring Miami Beach and Wynwood, and earning community service hours.

2023 Tuition and Fees*

Residential and commuter students participating in the three-week Summer Scholars Program receive a **tuition savings of more than half the standard UM undergraduate cost per credit.†**

Program Deposit

To secure a place in the Pre-College program, a \$500 non-refundable deposit is required within two weeks of receiving an acceptance notification. The deposit is credited toward the tuition fee. The program fee balance is due by June 1, 2023.

Other Expenses

Students should bring additional funds for personal expenses and souvenirs.

Application Requirements

The three-week Summer Scholars Program and two-week UM Academies are for high school students who are active in their communities, leaders in their schools, and examples of integrity. Individuals should be mature, self-motivated, and prepared to study an academic discipline in a rigorous scholarly program.

Eligibility

Students must meet:

1. MINIMUM GRADE POINT AVERAGE OF 3.0 (BASED ON A 4.0 SCALE)

Application Deadlines

Applications are accepted on a rolling basis and reviewed when all required documents are received. Please allow seven to ten business days for an admission decision. Submit your application documents as soon as possible for early consideration.
